






### Background of OBS Work

- One, non-paid volunteer 'coordinator'



# Cowpens National Battlefield Mandate


To return the battlefield to the way it looked when the Battle of Cowpens was fought on January 17, 1781.

- •"...the woods were open and free from swamps..." -- Banastre Tarleton


